**ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1982**  
**REGULATION NO. 4 OF 2001 OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1982**

It is hereby notified that the Road Traffic (Bus Registration and Safety) Amendment Regulations 2001 became effective from the 22nd June 2001.

All operators of buses and public hire vehicles will need to familiarise themselves with the size and safety requirements of the above regulation, which relates to new bus registrations effective forthwith, in respect of currently oversized buses up to the year 2006, and in respect of the safety requirements that are effective within three months.

**DRAFT REVISED NORFOLK ISLAND PLAN – PUBLIC EXHIBITION AND CONSULTATION**

The Minister for Health and Environment, the Hon. John McCoy, has prepared a draft Norfolk Island Plan pursuant to section 8 of the Planning Act 1996 (“the Act”). It is proposed that the draft Plan will replace the existing Norfolk Island Plan 1997. The draft plan sets out land use & development controls for Norfolk Island having regard to the social, economic and environmental impacts of development on the community.

Pursuant to section 9 of the Act, the Minister will consult with the community on the draft Plan in accordance with the measures established in this notice.

Pursuant to section 9(1) of the Act, the Minister invites public submissions and comments about the draft Plan. The draft Plan will be on public exhibition from Friday 6<sup>th</sup> July 2001 until Friday 28 September 2001.
