### **Exciting day for Norfolk Air as new aircraft arrives**

The community was abuzz on Monday afternoon, when the new Norfolk Air Boeing 737-200 aircraft touched down to reveal its Norfolk Island colours. The aircraft has been painted in blue and green and features a large stylised Norfolk Island pine on its tail in the same style as the logo used by Norfolk Tourism.

The distinctive Norfolk Air plane will now be based in Norfolk Island, and will perform most of the air services to and from Australia. The new plane brought with it around 50 travel writers and a group of celebrities on a direct flight from Melbourne. OzJet Airlines covered all costs associated with the flight and the programme of events for the visitors, including a champagne reception, tour of the Island and a charity rock concert.

The new Norfolk Air plane will become a flying billboard for the Island as it travels to and from Sydney, Brisbane and Newcastle. Norfolk Air continues to expand its schedule, and from May will be flying on five days per week. Norfolk Airport will have RPT operations six days each week when changes to Air New Zealand services commence late in February.
