PASSENGER PROCESSING ARRANGEMENTS
NORFOLK ISLAND AIRPORT

A recent assessment and evaluation of the passenger processing procedures at the airport for passengers arriving into Norfolk Island has highlighted an increase in prohibited goods being carried.

As a result there will be an increase in the amount of luggage being X-rayed on arrival into Norfolk Island.

With cooperation from passengers it is expected that there will be no delays for passengers who have complied with the entry requirements. Those travellers who are unsure about their declaration should indicate such before processing starts as there are severe penalties for making a false declaration and penalties for the importation of prohibited goods.

Passengers are reminded that goods (including personal effects) brought into Norfolk Island and not the subject of a proper import entry form being lodged and passed by Customs are subject to the control of the Collector of Customs until they have passed out of an area set aside for inspection by Customs.

The control of the Collector especially includes the right of the Collector to examine all goods subject to such control.

Norfolk Island laws also govern the importation into Norfolk Island of various items such as food (including ingredients), weapons and replicas, alcohol, drugs (legal and illegal), poisons and dangerous substances as well as the identification of persons and things likely to pose risks to health, contagious diseases, animals or plants.

IF UNSURE, DECLARE IT – SERIOUS PENALTIES APPLY FOR IMPORTATION OF PROHIBITED GOODS CONTRARY TO OUR LAWS.

PASTURAGE AND ENCLOSURE ACT 1949

Regulation 5

I, Ronald John Ward, Minister for the Environment, direct the owners of stock depastured under the *Pasturage and Enclosure Act 1949*, to muster the stock for drenching and inspection by the Stock Inspector at one of the following places between 7 am and 3 pm on any of the dates indicated below for that area. Dates are subject to change depending on the weather. Any variation of dates will be notified over the local radio.

Cattle owners are required to attend in person, at the appropriate muster place to assist the Stock Inspector. Cattle owners may appoint an agent to attend the muster on their behalf, at the appropriate muster place(s) to assist the Stock Inspector. All such appointments shall be in writing and handed to the Stock Inspector prior to muster. Failure to attend muster or failure to submit the written appointment of an agent will result in that cattle owner being ineligible to be granted pasturage rights for the next 12-month period beginning April 2015, in accordance with the approved *Pasturage Rights Policy*.

It should be further noted that an approved right of pasturage must exist in respect of calves over the age of 6 months, which are expected to be depastured on common land.

CAMPING IN POINT HUNTER AND GOVERNMENT HOUSE GROUNDS RESERVES

I, Peter Martin Davidson, Conservator of Public Reserves, hereby approve under Section 37 of the *Public Reserves Act 1997* the area within Point Hunter Reserve and Government House Grounds Reserve marked on the map below to be an area which may be used for camping overnight from 1 December 2014 until 23 February 2015.



Residents wishing to camp at Kingston during December 2014, or January or February 2015 should apply in writing to the Conservator of Public Reserves before 14 November 2014.

Applications should include:

1. The period during which it is desired to camp;
2. The number and names of campers it is proposed will be using the site; and
3. The number of tents intended to be erected.

Applications will only be approved for tents erected on designated campsites within the approved camping area.

Camping permits will be granted for up to three (3) weeks. Permits may be renewed only if the conditions applying to the original camping permit have been complied with.

Applicants should note that:

1. No dogs or other domestic animals will be permitted in the areas approved for camping.
2. No attachments to trees, other than by rope will be permitted.
3. No solid construction: for instance utilising timber rails, timber or metal posts, pallets, iron sheets or the like, will be permitted.

Applicants should also be aware that the *Public Reserves Act 1997* prohibits:

- depositing litter, refuse and garbage;
- lighting fires, other than in an approved fireplace or a portable gas barbecue or stove;
- interfering with a natural feature;
- picking or removing plants; and
- leaving or using motor vehicles in the area approved for camping, or on other parts of a public reserve not approved for that purpose (including the golf course).

Applications should be lodged at the Registry Office, New Military Barracks, Kingston.
