REFERENDUM ACT 1964
RESULT OF THE REFERENDUM HELD ON 8 MAY 2015
DECLARATION OF POLL

I, Yvon French, Returning Officer appointed under section 11 of the *Legislative Assembly Act 1979*, and for the purposes of section 3 of the *Referendum Act 1964*, hereby declare the results of the Referendum held on 8 May 2015 to ascertain the opinion of the electors of Norfolk Island on the question —

“Should the people of Norfolk Island have the right to freely determine their political status, their economic, social and cultural development and be consulted at referendum or plebiscite on the future model of governance for Norfolk Island before such changes are acted on by the Australian Parliament? — Yes or No”

Yes - 624
 No - 266
 Informal Votes – 22

As the number of votes cast at the referendum in favour of the exceed the number of votes cast at the referendum by not less than 10 per centum of the total number of votes (including informal votes) then in accordance with subsection 24(2) of the *Referendum Act 1964* the electors are deemed to have expressed their opinion in favour of the question.

Votes were counted in accordance with sections 21, 22 and 23 of the *Referendum Act 1964*.

The Administration of Norfolk Island invites Expressions of Interest to agist stock in one or more of the following areas —

1. Portion 26w, New Cascade Road ('Poppa's paddock')
 2. Portion 183 (an area in DCA Circle known as DC4 and DC5)
 3. Portion 183 (airport Areas A, B and C)

The term of the proposed leases will be up to three (3) years, renewable annually provided the lease conditions have been fully complied with. The agistment fee is to be paid six (6) monthly in advance.

The lessee will be required to:

- provide and maintain all fencing so that it will contain the agisted animals at all times;
- if the area is not already fenced with barbed wire and posts, erect electric fencing comprising at least three strands of plain wire;
- in the airport Area, erect and maintain fencing as specified by the Airport Manager (Note: airport airside primary boundary fencing will be erected and maintained by NI Airport);
- slash the area at least once a year;
- provide and maintain a water supply;
- ensure stock enclosed on the leased area have sufficient feed: providing feed if necessary;
- maintain the area in a clean and tidy condition which is to be free of any noxious weeds; and
- provide \$10M public liability insurance.

Tenderers should make their own enquiries as to the suitability of the land for the Tenderer's intended purpose.

- It is a requirement of all Administration cleaning contracts that public liability insurance to the value of \$5 million and membership to an approved workers compensation scheme are held. Prospective tenderers are strongly advised to obtain quotations on insurance before submitting tenders.

- Successful tenderers will be required to provide their own cleaning equipment and materials.

PASSENGER PROCESSING ARRANGEMENTS
NORFOLK ISLAND AIRPORT

Further assessments and evaluation of the passenger processing procedures carried out in conjunction with arriving passengers indicate a need to increase the level of surveillance on goods arriving at Norfolk Island to address the increased risk of prohibited goods being imported.

Changes which have been made will result in an increase in the number of passenger's luggage being subject to examination.

With cooperation from passengers and compliance with the requirements of the laws that govern the importation of matters such as drugs, plants, fruits and firearms it is expected that there will be no delays for passengers who have complied with the entry requirements. Passengers who do not comply with the entry requirements can expect delays whilst procedures for their situation are worked through. Those travellers who are unsure about their declaration should indicate such before processing starts as there are severe penalties for making a false declaration and penalties for the importation of prohibited goods.
