



## **MEDIA RELEASE**

### *Travelling to Norfolk Island from South Australia*

Due to a recently identified cluster of COVID-19 cases, visitors from South Australia may not travel to Norfolk Island. Residents and essential services personnel may travel provided they have not been in any hotspot areas or show symptoms of COVID-19 but must get tested and quarantine for 14 days. This restriction will be reviewed on Thursday 3 December 2020.

Recent arrivals on Norfolk Island have been identified and will be assessed for COVID-19.

### *Travelling to Norfolk Island from Victoria*

Quarantine requirements for travellers from Victoria will be removed this Monday 23 November 2020.

### *Contact tracing capability testing*

Some gaps in contact tracing were identified during testing. We remind businesses that they are required to maintain a contact register that includes all staff and visitors to your business that are there for more than 15 minutes and keep it for a period of 3 months for contact tracing purposes.

We will be testing contact tracing capability again in a couple of weeks and will advise of the dates in a future media release.
