### *Easing of restrictions associated with Greater Brisbane 3-day lockdown and travel to Norfolk Island*

The Queensland Government has announced this morning (Monday 11 January 2021) that the current restrictions covering the Greater Brisbane will be eased from 6:00pm this evening. The easing of the restrictions includes removing the travel ban and people can leave their homes for any purpose and can travel anywhere in Australia subject to local restrictions. There is a requirement to wear a mask in public and in airports and travelling on planes.

There have been no new confirmed cases in Queensland in the last 24 hours and therefore the risk from Queensland travellers to the island remains very low.

From 6pm tonight all travellers from Queensland to the island will not be required to undertake self-isolation on arrival and any people who have arrived on the island from Brisbane since Friday January 8<sup>th</sup> can come out of self-isolation.
