Victorian case and public exposure sites.

Victoria announced on Wednesday a single locally acquired case of COVID-19 associated with a quarantine worker. It has introduced new restrictions and requires anybody who has visited tier 1 public exposure sites to immediately isolate and get tested. They must remain isolated for 14 days.

This is a Victorian Government mandatory requirement and means that anyone who has been in the listed public exposure sites, at the times specified, cannot travel to the island. The list of public exposure sites can be found at <https://www.dhhs.vic.gov.au/case-locations-and-outbreaks-covid-19>.

Travellers from Victoria should be aware of these requirements and would be in breach of Victorian directions if they did not comply.

EMT will continue to monitor the situation in Victoria.
