

INTERESTING ITEMS FROM THE COLLECTION

Today's collection highlight from the Norfolk Island Museum is a black and white aerial photograph taken of Kingston in 1966 by the New Zealand Aerial Mapping company (NZAM).



The photo is one of three in the collection taken on 25th June 1966, however, it was noted the photographs were part of 139 photographs taken on the day.

The photograph shows the buildings prior to their restoration with the Old Protestant Chapel without a roof. There is a road leading to lone pine through today's golf course and baby pine trees are just visible at the back of Emily Bay, while none are present along Watermill.
